Goal One: Empowered Learning

Students demonstrate strong achievement across provincial learning outcomes, engage critically and continuously progress as learners.

- Observing an increase in students accessing resources from the library

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Highlight - Literacy & Numeracy Instruction:

Redwater school recognizes that literacy is essential for education achievement and underpins a student's ability to find success across curriculums, develop social emotional skills, and form the capacity for lifelong learning. The current literacy plan has two components. The first component focuses on increasing reading comprehension skills via explicit comprehension and vocabulary instruction obtained from RCAT data analysis. This focused vocabulary instruction in Math classes will also help students develop strong numerical literacy and strengthen problem solving skill sets. The second component focuses on the cultivation of the passion of reading for students with activities such as read in week, book displays, free reading, and book fairs.

- Create prioritized action plan to support a welcoming, caring, respectful and safe school community
- Discuss this goal at the school council to build awareness and involve them in the school action plan
- Communicate progress with staff, students, and parents

- Increased opportunities for students to be involved with creating a welcoming, safe, caring and respectful environment


